

<i>Activity Type and Description</i>	<i>Ideas for Activity</i>
<p>Multiple choice</p> <p>Allows students to select one or more options in response to a prompt.</p> <p>Instructors can mark one or more options as the correct answer.</p> <p>You can present the results as a bar chart, column chart, or donut chart. (Note: see end of this guide for additional information on switching visual formats.)</p> <p>Poll Everywhere support page on multiple choice</p>	<p>Ask students a yes/no question</p> <p>Ask students a question with multiple response options in order to check their understanding of a concept, get input about the class</p> <p>Ask students to share their opinion on a topic</p> <p>Take attendance by asking students to select the option that you verbally relayed to them during class</p> <p>Assign students to groups or teams</p>
<p>Word cloud</p> <p>Creates a visual where words submitted by respondents are placed in a cloud with more frequently mentioned words larger in size.</p> <p>Best to ask questions that elicit one-word responses.</p> <p>Poll Everywhere support page on word cloud questions</p>	<p>What is one word that you would use to describe X?</p> <p>What words do you associate with X?</p>
<p>Open-ended questions (Text wall, cluster, spotlight)</p> <p>The open-ended question type allows you to display students' responses in different visual formats. (Note: see end of this guide for additional information on switching visual formats.)</p> <p>The text wall posts responses in a stacked manner on the screen with new responses at the top.</p> <p>Cluster presents responses in an array that fills your entire screen (older responses get pushed down).</p> <p>Spotlight scrolls through responses one at a time, highlighting a response in the middle.</p> <p>Poll Everywhere support page on open-ended questions</p>	<p>Ask students open-ended questions about the topic</p> <p>What is something that you would like to learn about X?</p> <p>What are some tools that you have used in the past to do X?</p>

<p>Q&A</p> <p>Allows students to submit a longer answer in response to a prompt.</p> <p>Students can vote up or down others' responses.</p> <p>Poll Everywhere support page on Q&A</p>	<p>What is something from today's session that you are still confused about?</p> <p>What topics would you like to discuss/review next week?</p> <p>What questions do you have for our guest speaker?</p>
<p>Clickable image</p> <p>Ask students a visual question where they respond by clicking on a part of an image</p> <p>Instructors can mark one or more options as the correct answer</p> <p>Poll Everywhere support page on clickable image questions</p> <p>Note: Students using a device with a small touch screen may have difficulty tapping on their desired answers.</p>	<p>Ask students to select something on a map</p> <p>Provide a two-by-two matrix on which students place themselves</p>
